Dear People Whom God Loves,

GOD (Love) and Evolution

It is essential that we not confuse theology and science. They both deal with the universe, but not in the same way.

Science shows us what the universe is like and how it works. This is always ongoing. The scientific view of the universe today is very different from the view centuries ago. Science cannot and is not supposed to explain why the universe exists. It accepts what exists and tells us wonderful information about it. Science is based on observation and reason. That is its grandeur and its limitation.

Theology on the other hand is based on the belief that there is something, which is not a thing, beyond the universe. This something, again not a thing, gives us an understanding of why there is a universe. It helps us understand that there is a purpose to the universe, and that there is a mysterious presence in the universe that is not accessible to science. This belief is reasonable, but it cannot be proven by reason. It is another kind of knowing. Theology leads us to a mysterious realization that there is something more. There is something ultimate and beyond what meets the eye that is very real and often changes the way we look at everyone and everything.

This realization can happen to us when our child is born, when we see the mountains, the ocean, the Grand Canyon, the sunset, when we are alone on a walk through the woods, when we are quiet and reflective, when we pray, when we experience love in a new and deep way, when we experience forgiveness and a vision of a new path. It can happen in church.

I see science and theology as friends who need each other to help us see and live life in a deeper way. Belief can help us find meaning in a way that reason does not. Reason can help our belief not to wander into paths that are

destructive.

There are primary and secondary causes of creation.

Theologians often speak of God (the creator) as the primary cause. Creatures (including humans) that cause things are called secondary causes.

This is a crucial distinction because we are speaking of two very different processes. I prefer not to call creating a primary cause, because it is mysterious and not just a bigger way of causing than the way creatures cause.

When creatures cause, they use something to cause a result. There was nothing for God to use to make the cosmos. That is why we call it creation from nothing.

I see similarity between creating and the way creatures cause things, beyond the fact that both produce a result.
